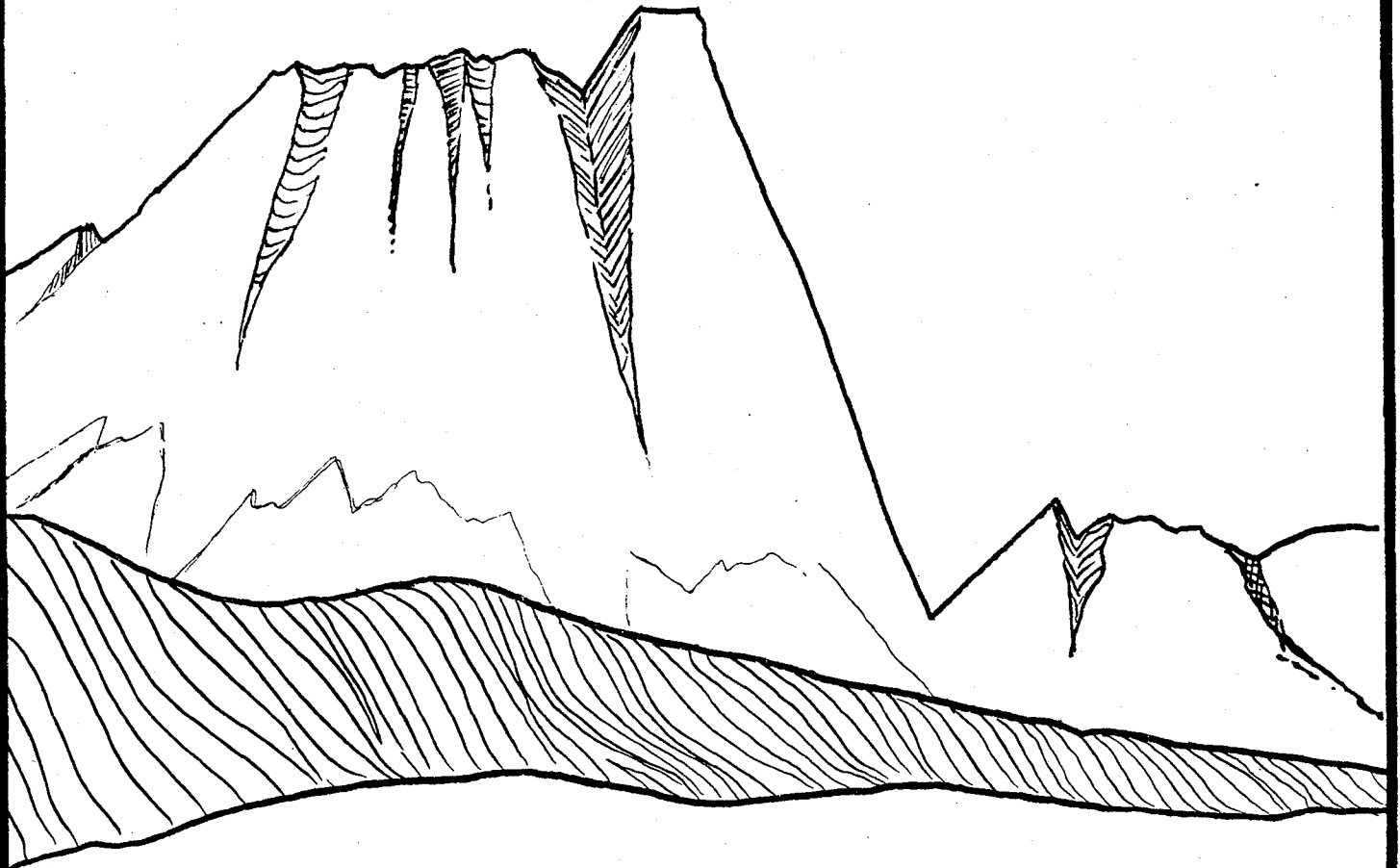

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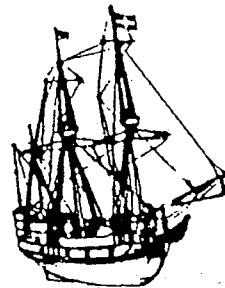

Let us hope that all will rally now that there is this new chance to secure some development.

At a specially called meeting of the Joplin Commercial club held Wednesday evening a motion prevailed to hold the annual clean up day on Saturday, April 28, and to enlist the services of the local troop of Boy Scouts in burning the weeds on the vacant premises; a donation of \$5.00 to be made to the Scouts.

The desirability of changing the location of the tourists' camp was discussed and the following were appointed to investigate the matter and report at the next meeting: M.L. Jensen, Thos. M. Brandt and Hawley Wymond.

A new set of by-laws was presented and signed by 12 and will be circulated for signatures; it should carry the names of 30 men interested in the welfare of Joplin.

JOPLIN FIRES PROVED DISASTROUS

Disastrous fires at various times sweeping through the main business area of Joplin, have wiped out many of the finest business structures, some of which have never been replaced.

Such a fire occurred in September, 1925 when a blaze started in the loft of the Ole Grimstad pool hall, rapidly spread to the adjacent buildings and wiped out every building in that immediate vicinity. Not only was the Grimstad pool hall destroyed, but the hall next door; in which the community held their meetings, had their dances, and in which the high school played basketball was also burned to the ground. The Joplin post office was destroyed, along with the M.L. Jensen hardware and farm implement building. Tury Hyle's barber shop also went up in smoke.

Jensen at once moved in another building and was soon in business again. O.J. Hanson moved in a building in which to house the post office. Hyle started business in the Tolley building at the east end of town.

As a direct result of the fire, the Modern Woodmen held a meeting, to which they invited many non-members who might be interested in building a new hall. At this meeting, it was decided to make a drive for enough money to build a new hall, a Modern Woodmen hall, large enough to accommodate almost any size audience that might want to enter it, with a basketball playing floor and room for spectators. A committee composed of Wm (Billy) Meldrum, H.B. Wolfe, John W. Hutchison, W.C. Kester and Sherman Sorenson was appointed as a finance committee to raise money and build the hall. Meldrum was elected Chairman of the committee. Kester was Secretary, and Wolfe Treasurer.

In less than a month, the committee had enough cash and pledges to start work on the building and about the 1st of November, construction started. It was planned to do the work with donation labor; and the women of the town prepared and served hot dinners to all who came to work. Later, it was decided it would be necessary to have a carpenter on the job to plan parts of the building, especially the roof, and to direct the work of the unskilled laborers who showed up each day for work. The Committee secured the services of J.B. Hay of Chester to direct the work and the building was finished and ready for use by the middle of December. By that time the Finance committee had raised almost enough money to pay for the building, but not quite. So a carnival, one of the first on the Hi-Line, was planned and put on December 18, which netted around \$800.00 which just about cleaned up all the bills left around town.

That building, later known as the Joplin Community Hall, served the town as meeting house, dance hall and basketball court for many, many years until the erection of the new, modern school building.
